





Our Horses

We have welcomed two new horses to the South Bucks team.

Harpa a 16.2hh, 10-year-old chestnut Portuguese warmblood mare, who is already a firm favourite qualifying four riders for the National Championships





Chorus a 15hh 13-year-old Grey Connemara gelding, he is very new and learning his job at the moment and will hopefully be in lessons soon.

We asked some of our volunteers about their favourite horses, and this is what they said.

Duke by Lucinda

Often uncertain what to expect and of what is expected of me, I soon found Duke to be an empathetic soul. His sensitivity combined with the transparency of his feelings makes him a great teacher, for should I slide back the bolt of his stable and be greeted with a scowl, the likelihood is I need to calm down and show greater consideration in my actions. When my appearance is barely worth waking up for, I can be reasonably certain I'm on the right track. Whenever I am at a loss at a time when Duke is in his stable, then a little chat with him and possibly a wiggly nosed nuzzle always helps me to get back into the swing of things.



While leading Duke in lessons, he has on occasions been quite forthright in letting me know if he is concerned or displeased but he has never done so in a way that has been a risk to his rider, even in those times when his mane has been tugged or a sudden shout echoes in our ears. He pays attention to people and is impressively solid when the odd bean bag or yellow duck drops through the air.







When I am lucky enough to ride Duke, I don't ever want to get off (except perhaps for a quick stretch) as he feels as comfortable and safe as sitting in a favoured sofa spot. Schooling sessions may sometimes end with me blowing harder than he is but typically find me hugging his neck like a limpet, so pleased am I with how hard he's tried and the lovely feeling he has given me. Joyful and enthusiastic out on a hack, Duke has always been brave enough to take the lead should a stablemate falter in the face of a tree stump or two.

Duke's loyalty is honourable, at least to George, and taking him out to their field, slipping off his headcollar (while simultaneously bracing as a scratching post) and watching him set off to find his friend is one of my day's great pleasures.

Wolfie by Claire

I have been volunteering at South Bucks RDA for a year, and I love every moment of my time on the yard. I am a Tuesday morning helper, and from my very first day was made to feel so welcome by the wonderful group of staff and volunteers.

I hadn't been around horses for quite some time, so I had lots of questions, but nothing was too much trouble and I have learnt so much.



It's a place that gives so much back to the volunteers. I feel so present and relaxed when on the yard, the horses have a calming aura and I love the break it gives me from my busy life as a mum of two teenage boys, wife and business owner! I feel like I've really bonded with some of the young people who come along on a Tuesday, it's a place where they can learn to ride but also feel safe, share their thoughts and worries, have fun and feel part of this wonderful community. It really is a magical place.

I love working with all of the horses, but Wolfie and George are my firm favourites, even when Wolfie lets me know, he's not too keen on having his girth tightened!

I honestly believe the RDA will be part of my life forever more. Sometimes people say 'oh what a lovely thing you do' when I tell them I volunteer but honestly, I get as much out of it as I put in ... Tuesday mornings are definitely a highlight of my week.

Mabel by Hazel



Everybody loves Mabel, riders, volunteers and staff alike. She came to South Bucks RDA in May 2016 when she retired from her career in dressage. She is a very gentle 25-year-old bay, thoroughbred/Irish draught whose registered name is, inappropriately in my opinion, Criminal Girl.

Children who have never been on a horse before soon gain confidence on Mabel. Over the years at SBRDA she has also helped the more experienced riders progress and gain enough confidence to go to regional and national competitions with lots of success. Our Volunteers

Don't forget there is lots of E-Learning on the RDA National E-Learning website – www.rda-learning.org.uk, with useful and interesting short courses, covering areas such as: Safeguarding; Equine Knowledge; Disability Awareness; and Person-Centred Approaches.

If any volunteers would like to be even more involved, there is a new RDA role of Activity Leader which we would like to include at South Bucks, the role oversees non ridden activities e.g., stable management sessions, tea with a pony, pat-a-pony sessions etc. This will enable us to offer more opportunities to our participants. The flow chart below shows you the training you need. If you are interested speak to Frankie and/or Theresa who is happy to guide you through this.

Oversees: Tea with a Pony, Horse care for proficiency tests, ASDAN plus unmounted static horse sessions with or without barrier between participant and horse. A hat is recommended to be worn by participants where possible during static sessions. Group Training: Green Card Preparing & Assisting RDA Sessions volunteer module E-Learning Training: Disability Awareness Equine Knowledge Face to Face Training: Safeguarding Declaration form is signed off by Group Trustees & Coach as a suitable person who has: Completed Training Completed Risk Assessment and Session Plans (Group Coach to guide on these) Yearly review and re-submission of the form



Adrian joined the Group as a physically disabled rider in the late eighties. Although he worked full time, he was a regular weekend rider and was involved in many of the Group's activities. He was one of the stars of the Musical Ride 'the Kings New Clothes' which performed at Stoneleigh in 1990. He moved to Devon when he retired from work, where he sadly died. He leaves a wife Gill, a son and a granddaughter.





Ann Cutcliffe OBE

Ann joined the Group in 1985 and very soon became a regular instructor. She was very popular and innovative and much loved by the riders whom she taught. She was particularly interested in Dressage and lent her horse Huggybear to some of the riders to compete at the National Championships. After many years at South Bucks, she went on to Chair the RDA Dressage Committee and later became involved in the British Paralympic Association and joined the International Paralympic Equestrian Committee. She leaves a husband Peter, two daughters and three grandchildren.

Hats


Please can everyone borrowing a hat take care of our hats – we had a problem last week at the Regional Show when some labels had been pulled out since they were last checked, and we were unable to use them (there was only a small panic!) All labels are important especially the Kitemark. We are now having to replace 12 more hats. If you are riding regularly, it is worth buying a hat of your own. The current standards are:



- British PAS 015: 2011 with BSI Kitemarked or Inspec IC Marked.
- European VG1 with BSI Kitemarked or Inspec IC marked
- EN1384-2017 with BSI Kitemarked or Inspec IC marked
- American ASTM F1163: 2004a or 04a onwards provided it is SEI marked
- SNELL E2016 with a Kitemark.
